We kept in touch throughout our school years and visited many times in the summers. His mother and Father, Dorothy and Frank were great people. I visited them one afternoon a few months before Dorothy's death. We had a great time discussing what troubles Steve and I got into as kids.

Both of us enrolled at Pittsburg State University in the Fall of 1959. Steve played football his freshman year and I played basketball. Steve left school after his freshman year and entered the Air Force, I stayed and graduated in 1964, then I too, entered the Air Force. I lost track of Steve for many years and we found each other sometime in the '70s. He was working for a blood bank or something in that field. Years later, I learned from his sister Marilyn, that he had moved to Alabama and had heart problems. I had his phone number at one time, but lost it.
